
Reception Class and Year 6 give thanks to God.

AWARENESS DAY Developmental Language Disorder

Today is Awareness Day for **Developmental Language Disorder** (DLD). This is a condition which affects approximately 2 children per class but is often overlooked as it is not a condition that can be seen. Children and adults who have DLD may have difficulty with understanding others and putting what they want to say into sentences. They can find it difficult to develop friendships or communicate in groups. They struggle to keep up with peers or get involved. It is not always obvious when someone has DLD which is why it is so important we are all aware of it. With the right support those with DLD can develop confidence, can make friends and can achieve well at school.
