

Zephaniah was a prophet in the Old Testament. The Bible describes him as the son of Cushi. (Cushi in Hebrew means somebody of Ethiopian descent). This has led many scholars to believe that Zephaniah had African heritage and dark skin.

Among the warnings he shared from God Zephaniah also spoke of God's love for us:

The LORD your God is with you; the mighty One will save you. He will rejoice over you.
You will rest in his love; he will sing and be joyful about you."

Zephaniah 3 v 17

Simon of Cyrene

In Matthew 27 v 32 we read this:

As the soldiers were going out of the city with Jesus, they forced a man from Cyrene, named Simon, to carry the cross for Jesus.

The ruins of Cyrene can be found in modern day Libya in Northern Africa.



Simeon and Lucius

We read about Simeon and Lucius in Acts $13 \ v \ 1$, they are listed among the prophets and teachers of the church in Antioch.

Simeon was also called Niger, possibly because of his dark skin tone whilst Lucius was from the city of Cyrene just like Simon who carried the cross of lesus.



The Ethiopian Eunuch

In Acts 8 we see Philip sharing the gospel with a man from Ethiopia. This man would have carried the Good News about Jesus home with him. What a vibrant and diverse church God was creating as the Good News spread throughout the world!
